

A Chart and Compass with Power






Jeremiah 10:23 (KJV) — 23 O LORD, I know that the way of man is not in himself: it is not in man that walketh to direct his steps.

Additional truth is not brought out; but God has through the Testimonies simplified the great truths already given and in His own chosen way brought them before the people to awaken and impress the mind with them, that all may be left without excuse. (Testimonies for the Church, vol. 2, p. 605.2b)






