The (Ten day) between the two evenings was the Day of the Atonement, Sabbath of Rest. (A 24 hour period).

On the first day of unleavened bread, when they sacrificed the Passover, his disciples asked him, "Where do you want us to go and make ready that you may eat the Passover?" ¶ He sent two of his disciples, and said to them, "Go into the city, and there you will meet a man carrying a pitcher of water. Follow him, and wherever he enters in, tell the master of the house, 'The Teacher says, "Where is the guest room, where I may eat the Passover with my disciples?" He will himself show you a large upper room furnished and ready. Make ready for us there." ¶ His disciples went out, and came into the city, and found things as he had said to them, and they prepared the Passover. Also in Luke 22:7-13

Note: At the time when Jesus gave the disciples his instructions to go to made ready the Passover, was some time in the afternoon before evening was come, it was time enough to get things ready, on the daylight hours the 13th day of the month of Abib, Thursday the 5th day of the week, before the evening of the 14th Friday the six day of the week. Hebrews began their day at sunset. Each day would begin at evening and end at evening. Jesus would eat the Passover the evening, or night, of the day that He died, the 14th a Friday.

JESUS FORETELLS PETER'S DENIAL

- 30 And when they had sung an hymn, they went out into the mount of Olives.
- 31 Then saith Jesus unto them, All ye shall be offended because of me this night: for it is written, I will smite the shepherd, and the sheep of the flock shall be scattered abroad.
- 32 But after I am risen again, I will go before you into Galilee.
- 33 Peter answered and said unto him, Though all *men* shall be offended because of thee, *yet* will I never be offended.
- 34 Jesus said unto him, Verily I say unto thee, That this night, before the cock crow, thou shalt deny me thrice.

JESUS PRAYS IN GETHSEMANE

In company with His disciples, the Saviour slowly made His way to the garden of Gethsemane. The Passover moon, broad and full, shone from a cloudless sky. The city of pilgrims' tents was hushed into silence.

Jesus had been earnestly conversing with His disciples and instructing them; but as He neared Gethsemane, He became strangely silent. He had often visited this spot for meditation and prayer; but never with a heart so full of sorrow as upon this night of His last agony. Throughout His life on earth He had walked in the light of God's presence. When in conflict with men who were inspired by the very spirit of Satan, He could say, "He that sent Me is with Me: the Father hath not left Me alone; for I do always those things that please Him." John 8:29. But now He seemed to be shut out from the light of God's sustaining presence. Now He was numbered with the transgressors. The guilt of fallen humanity He must bear. Upon Him who knew no sin must be laid the iniquity of us all. So dreadful does sin appear to Him, so great is the weight of guilt which He must bear, that He is tempted to fear it will shut Him out forever from His Father's love. . DA 685.1-DA 685.2

- 40 And he cometh unto the disciples, and findeth them asleep, and saith unto Peter, What, could ye not watch with me one hour?
- 41 Watch and pray, that ye enter not into temptation: the spirit indeed *is* willing, but the flesh *is* weak.

JESUS FACES ANNAS AND CAIAPHAS

- 12 Then the band and the captain and officers of the Jews took Jesus, and bound him,
- 13 And led him away to Annas first; for he was father in law to Caiaphas, which was the high priest that same year.
- 14 Now Caiaphas was he, which gave counsel to the Jews, that it was expedient that one man should die for the people.

- 15. And Simon Peter followed Jesus, and so did another disciple: that disciple was known unto the high priest, and went in with Jesus into the palace of the high priest. -

THE HIGH PRIEST QUESTIONS JESUS

- 19. The high priest then asked Jesus of his disciples, and of his doctrine.
- 20. Jesus answered him, I spake openly to the world; I ever taught in the synagogue, and in the temple, whither the Jews always resort; and in secret have I said nothing.
- 21. Why askest thou me? ask them which heard me, what I have said unto them: behold, they know what I said.
- 22. And when he had thus spoken, one of the officers which stood by struck Jesus with the palm of his hand, saying, Answerest thou the high priest so? 23Jesus answered him, If I have spoken evil, bear witness of the evil: but if well, why smitest thou me?

PETER DENIES JESUS AGAIN

- 25 And Simon Peter stood and warmed himself. They said therefore unto him, Art not thou also *one* of his disciples? He denied *it*, and said, I am not.
- 26 One of the servants of the high priest, being *his* kinsman whose ear Peter cut off, saith, Did not I see thee in the garden with him?
- 27 Peter then denied again: and immediately the cock crew.

JESUS DELIVERED TO PILATE

- 1 When the morning was come, all the chief priests and elders of the people took counsel against Jesus to put him to death:
- 2 And when they had bound him, they led *him* away, and delivered him to Pontius Pilate the governor. Matthew 27:1-2

Every thing so far that was done against Jesus according to Hebrew law was unlawful. It was law fare, and rules were grossly violated, the accused was deprived of rights, arrested in the night, bound as a malefactor, beaten before his arraignment and stuck in open court during the trail. He was tried on a feast day and before sunrise, he was compelled to criminate himself, sentenced the same day of his conviction. Law was wholly disregarded by priests, judges, and no one defended him: betrayed for thirty pieces of silver by a friend, name Judas.

When the morning was come, It was the time of morning when the birds sing their hardest, the sun was just coming up. But Pilate didn't want it, he wanted to sleep. He knew he needed it, for this was the time when trouble could come, for today was the Passover. Pilate was told that the Jews had a prisoner to sentenced, and a quick decision on his part to please them would put the Jews in a good humor and perhaps make the weekend go better.

And when they had bound him, they led him away, and delivered him to Pontius Pilate the governor. all the chief priests and elders of the people took counsel against Jesus to put him to death: And Jesus stood before the governor: and the governor asked him, saying, Art thou the King of the Jews? And Jesus said unto him, Thou sayest. And when he was accused of the chief priests and elders, he answered nothing. Then said Pilate unto him, Hearest thou not how many things they witness against thee? And he answered him to never a word; insomuch that the governor marvelled greatly. This was about 6 Oclock in the morning of the day when these happened.

JUDAS HANGS HIMSELF

3 Then Judas, which had betrayed him, when he saw that he was condemned, repented himself, and brought again the thirty pieces of silver to the chief priests and elders,

4 Saying, I have sinned in that I have betrayed the innocent blood. And they said, What is that to us? see thou to that.

5 And he cast down the pieces of silver in the temple, and departed, and went and hanged himselfh. Matthew 27:3-5

- 11. And Jesus stood before the governor: and the governor asked him, saying, Art thou the King of the Jews? And Jesus said unto him, Thou sayest.

THE CROWD CHOOSES BARABBAS

- 15 Now at *that* feast the governor was wont to release unto the people a prisoner, whom they would.
- 16 And they had then a notable prisoner, called Barabbas.
- 17 Therefore when they were gathered together, Pilate said unto them, Whom will ye that I release unto you? Barabbas, or Jesus which is called Christ?
- 18. For he knew that for envy they had delivered him.

PILATE DELIVERS JESUS TO BE CRUCIFIED

And they crucified him, and parted his garments, casting lots: that it might be fulfilled which was spoken by the prophet, They parted my garments among them, and upon my vesture did they cast lots.

THE DEATH OF JESUS

Because Passover occurs each year at the end of march or beginning of April, we will assume that sunset on that particular day was at 6 p.m. since march 21 is the vernal equinox and the days and nights would be equal length at that time. Therefore sunrise, when Jesus was brought to Pilate at the "1st hour" was 6 a .m: Jesus was led out to be crucified, "the third hour ", or 9 am.; At the end sixth hour, or 12 noon, darkness covered the land, (Matthew 27:45, Mk 15:33, Lk 32:44, Jn 19:14). When the darkness ended, it was the ninth hour or 3 p. m. Very soon afterwards, He died. His burial was completed before 6 p.m.

JESUS IS BURIED

- 54. And that day was the preparation, and the sabbath drew on.
- 55. And the women also, which came with him from Galilee, followed after, and beheld the sepulchre, and how his body was laid.
- 56. And they returned, and prepared spices and ointments; and rested the sabbath day according to the commandment. -Luke 23:54-56

In the end of the sabbath, as it began to dawn toward the first day of the week, came Mary Magdalene and the other Mary to see the sepulchre.

The Hebrew word for atonement, \(\bar{1}\bar{2}\bar{2}\) (kaphar), literally means to cover. While our sins are covered by the blood, they must also be removed from not only the record books of heaven but from our lives as well! The atonement of forgiveness made at the cross, as important as it is, is not the full and final atonement that must be made for the total restoration of man so that he can be in the presence of a holy God. A simple illustration will make this clear. A mother tells her daughter she may go play but must not get muddy. After a few minutes the daughter appears at the door crying. A fall has resulted in her white dress becoming brown. The mother looks on with pity. Quick to notice the repentant attitude of the child, she assures her of her love and forgiveness for getting muddy. However, even though she is forgiven, she is still dirty and must be cleansed! The atonement at Calvary provides forgiveness, but we must yet receive cleansing by the blood of Jesus in the heavenly sanctuary. "How much more shall the blood of Christ, who through the eternal Spirit offered himself without spot to God, purge your conscience from dead works to serve the living God (Hebrews 9:14)?"
